

McCormick Creek G. C. Recap:

The MSGA's seventh tournament of 2010, a Member/Guest event, was held at McCormick Creek G. C. in Nappanee, Indiana on August 9th. The turnout was 71 players including three guests. It was the MSGA's second tournament at McCormick Creek.

The weather was overcast and hot and humid to start with play being interrupted by short shower about halfway through the round. After the shower, the sun came out, but the weather remained hot and humid with the temperatures in the mid 80's. The golf course was in very good condition and the soft greens were receptive to good shots especially after the rain. The conditions led to many good scores. Overall with handicaps, 35 players bested par of 72 with seven others matching par.

In the Individual Medal competition, the overall low gross winner was Doug Chapman with a two over par 74. Doug's round included four birdies. Jay Harrison was second with a 75 while nine others shot 80 or better. Jack Niland was the low net winner with a nine under par 63. Jay Harrison and Dave Mason also had 63's, but lost the tie-breaker. Bill Carlisle and Bob McFadden were one shot back with 64's while Jerry Orman and Gene Greiger each carded 65's.

In the Skins competition, Louie Slabach, Mike Martin and Jerry Orman were multiple winners with two skins each. In total, there were 20 skins in the four flights. Chuck Bridegroom nearly won the Hole-in-one-Contest when his shot on the par 3 seventh hole (147 yards) ended up five inches from the hole. Jerry Orman was a multiple winner in the Closest-to-the-pin contest with wins on holes 12 and 14. Congratulations to prize winners in all the flights, a list of which can be found on the Tournament Results tab.

In the season-long Brady Cup competition, Mike Gilpin continues to lead with 1250 points with Bruce Fisher moving into second with 1040 points. Eldon Miller remains third with 1025 points.
